**RICE COUNTY
DRUG COURT**



ESTABLISHED: July 2014

The Mission of Rice County Drug Court is to reduce the adverse impact of serious and repeat offenders on the citizens and criminal justice system of Rice County, and to create a system that is more effective for the participants.

ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA

- ❖ **Offense(s) motivated by Substance Use Disorder**
- ❖ **High Risk/High Need Offender**
- ❖ **Rice County Resident**
- ❖ **Preference to Parents**

RCDC MODEL

- ❖ **Post Plea/Condition of Probation**
- ❖ **Substance Use Disorder Treatment Required**
- ❖ **Three Phases of Structured Services and Accountability**

RCDC Hearings are scheduled every Thursday, 1:30 pm at the Rice County Court House.

The RCDC Team meets weekly prior to the Hearing to review participant admission and progress.

RCDC Staff assist participants plan their weekly schedule and make referrals for community based services including: mental health services, employment and education services, parent education, and housing support.

RCDC COMPONENTS

The Rice County Drug Court Team includes Treatment Providers for the integration of services into the RCDC Phases and a continuum of rehabilitative services.

Prosecution and Defense work together to promote public safety and protect a participant's due process rights.

Participants have frequent contact with the RCDC Judge throughout their participation: weekly in Phase One.

Participant progress is reviewed weekly by the RCDC Team. Incentives and Sanctions are recommended for the Hearing.

Abstinence is monitored by frequent Chemical Testing.

Participants are monitored in the community by Law Enforcement and RCDC Staff.
